are Jericho Way, From His Throne Ministries, Philander Smith College, Canvas Community Church, Buffington Towers, Southwest Little Rock Community Center, St. Francis House and Phoenix House.

The meal delivered for Monday, February 22, included a roll, fried chicken leg and thigh, corn and green beans.

A basket for donations will be located in the alcove between the outside and inside doors to the church office. Since shopping in stores continues to present a possible exposure to the Covid-19 virus or related alternate viruses, checks in support of these mission projects can be mailed to the church office with a note on the memo line MAP (Mission and Advocacy Project). Donated money will be used to purchase underwear items. All underwear will be given to the Clothes Closet at the Stew Pot.
