CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS AWARDED TO HUNGER RELIEF AGENCIES ACROSS ARKANSAS

LITTLE ROCK, AR (March 13, 2018) –The Arkansas Hunger Relief Alliance has just finished awarding more than \$188,000 in capacity building grants to hunger relief agencies around the state. The grants will help food banks, pantries, shelter, soup kitchens and other agencies increase their ability to serve the food insecure in their communities. Funds for the grants are provided through the State Food Purchase Program of the Arkansas Legislature.

Capacity building grants may be used to purchase appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, and stoves as well shelving, trailers, computers other equipment that will help feed more food insecure people. Grant dollars may not be used for salaries or personnel.

The Little Rock Stewpot received a grant from the Arkansas Hunger Alliance to buy a new stainless-steel refrigerator. Thanks, Arkansas Hunger Alliance. Ed is shown below with the new refrigerator
