February Mission Focus - Men's and Women's Underwear for Stewpot

Men and women's underwear is needed for unsheltered Stewpot clients. Men's new underwear, medium to large, is needed. Women's new underwear, sizes 8 through 12, medium to large bras, and medium size warm socks are needed. Women's gently worn bras and socks can also be donated. Please take donations to "The Box" at the church office door. Men's socks are not needed because of the large recent donation (2,500 pairs) of men's socks from BOMBAS. Stewpot Receives 2,500 Pairs of Socks from Bombas The Stewpot has received socks from Bombas for the last several years. Because of the Pandemic, they did not receive any socks in 2021. The order for 2021 was received in February 2022 and consisted of ten large



boxes each containing 250 pairs of socks for a total of 2,500 pairs. These socks are distributed throughout the year to Stewpot diners through the Clothes Closet. Because of the hours of Stewpot, the socks were delivered to the home of Charlie Frith. Nancy Howell, Chair of the Stewpot Board, made arrangements for a pickup truck to pick up the socks and deliver them to Stewpot. The Stewpot will receive more socks toward the end of 2022. This year we have also asked for underwear. The underwear is black and available in men's + women's dual sizing (knit boxer brief in men's style + hipster in women's style). Stewpot Donates Bombas Socks to El Zocalo

El Zócalo Immigrant Resource Center is a grassroots organization in Central Arkansas. Their mission



is to promote a dignified life for immigrants in Arkansas by connecting individuals and families with services and fostering community-wide understanding through education. Poverty, language and cultural barriers often make it difficult for immigrants to navigate life in Arkansas. The resource center takes a culturally informed approach, providing support needed for independence. El Zócalo means "town square" in Spanish. Word got out when some of the dinners saw the pizza being delivered. A much longer line than usual for the food formed quickly. From all the smiles from the diners, they certainly enjoyed the pizza and sodas.

For the past 40 years, Women and Children First has worked tirelessly to empower victims to live independently and free from domestic violence. WCF provides



crisis intervention, safe shelter, social and legal advocacy, and supports services for women and children. Westover Hills Presbyterian Church works closely with Women and Children First and supplies fresh fruit all summer to women and children at Women and Children First. Because the Stewpot has a much greater need for men's coats then women's coats, Charlie Frith asked Hangers Cleaners if they would be willing to donate some women's and kid's coats to Women and Children First. They said "Yes." Charlie and Charlotte Frith and Carolyn and Roy Nash from Westover Hills picked up almost 200 coats on two different occassions and delivered them to Women and Children First.
